Wishing each of you a happy and successful New Year!!



2015 EVENTS

In 2015 the NSFWA sponsored and participated in two events. First was our annual conference in West Yellowstone. Members of the NSFWA displayed 17 original Yellowstone Coaches and Mountain Wagons on the lawn of West Yellowstone Museum during their 8th Annual Conference on Saturday, June 20, 2015. Each of these horse-drawn vehicles has a history that can be traced back through years of use transporting "tourists" within Yellowstone Park. This is likely the most Yellowstone Coaches ever to be in one location in nearly a century. This historic event, "1915: The Twilight of Stagecoaches in Yellowstone", commemorated the hundredth anniversary of the last year that coaches were used in Yellowstone National Park. In 1916, motorized transportation replaced the Yellowstone Coaches. The occasion offered horse-drawn vehicle enthusiasts an opportunity to investigate, photograph and compare side-by-side examples of original and restored Yellowstone Coaches, some valued at over \$75,000. Historical presentations were made during the event describing the use of these rare vehicles and the history of their operation in transporting early visitors to see the wonders of Yellowstone Park. The event was well attended with nearly 100 NSFWA members taking part, along with members of the public who enjoyed the Yellowstone Coach display.

Secondly, on July 10 the NSFWA co-sponsored the 2nd annual Deadwood Stagecoach Days. The event included discussions on stagecoach travel, western art, early photography and the railroad. Saturday featured wagon and stagecoach demonstrations, wheelwright demonstration, fast draw exhibition, gold panning, old-fashioned children's games, musical entertainment and a chuck wagon meal. Doug Hansen demonstrated the riggings of the freight wagon hitch as well as discussion and an exhibition of the Deadwood stagecoach. The demonstrations were performed in the rodeo arena with Scott Porterfield assisting with his team. Enthusiasm was high, and attendees were eager to learn about the historic vehicles that made gold mining boom towns a reality.
